

College Trustees OK Plans for \$4.4 Million Library

Preliminary plans to construct a \$4.4 million library on its San Bernardino campus were approved yesterday by the California State Colleges Board of Trustees meeting in Los Angeles.

The trustees reviewed schematic drawings of the projected five-story plus full-basement structure, public affairs spokesman, Ed Green said last night.

"This means," he explained, "that they examined plans showing location and basic designs for the library. The next step will be for an architect to draw more advanced plans to submit to the trustees."

Green said it was still indefinite when ground would be broken for the building but approval of the "schematics" meant sanction for the overall project.

Also approved at yesterday's CSC trustees' meeting were plans for site development totaling \$375,800 at the San Bernardino campus.

The plans include improvements in the physical sciences building, physical education building, central utilities, and animal and greenhouse areas.

"The work involves various operations," college spokesman, Bob Reardon, reported, "including grading, irrigation systems, lighting, planting, spreading topsoil, and installing walkways."

Reardon said the projects were "all set to go" and bids would soon be solicited.

"Once the authority has been granted to go ahead with the work," he said, "things move very rapidly."

Many allocations are: \$103,500 for the physical sciences building site improvements, \$98,300 on the physical education building grounds, \$89,900 at the animal and greenhouse site, and \$84,100 in the central utilities building area.
